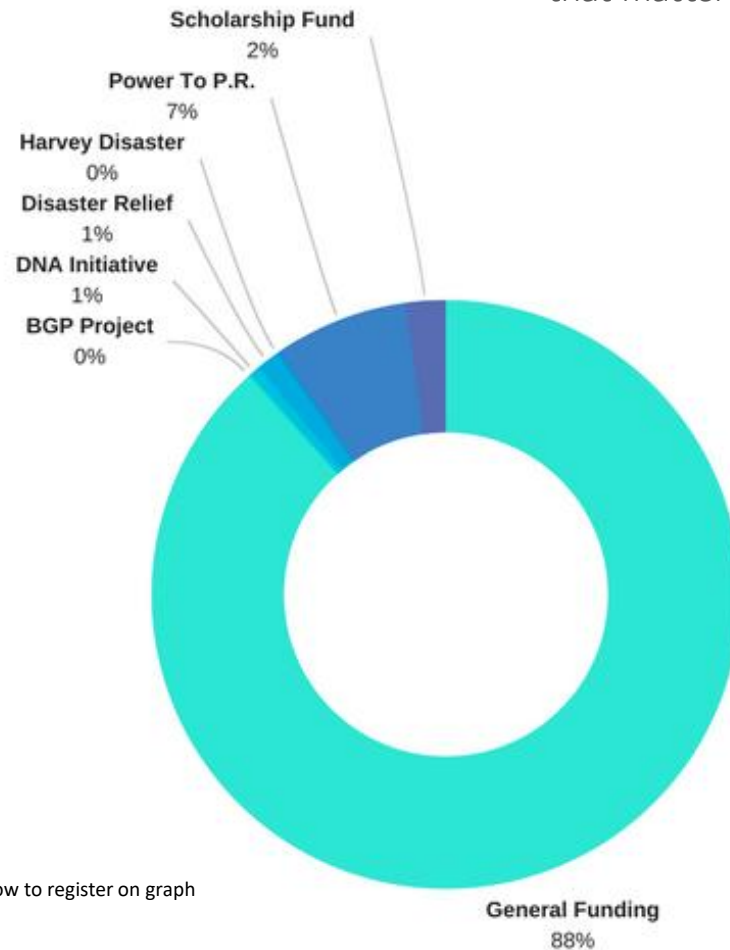

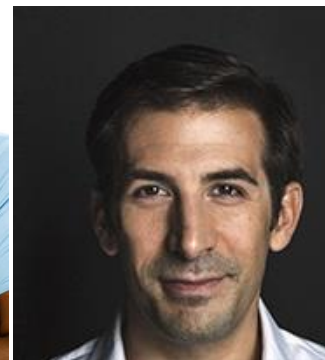


## IMPACT STRATEGY 2028 VISION
